ABOUT

Angel Tree is a program that works in partnership with the Prison Fellowship ministry. It is designed to support families with an incarcerated parent. Through Angel Tree, you have the chance to make a meaningful impact that extends beyond the holiday season, opening doors to year-round opportunities for engagement with these families and welcoming them into your life and church community. Our team will be in contact with you about further ways to engage with families and truly be the hands and feet of Jesus.

Here are some important details to note:

PRICE LIMIT

The expected gift price limit is a maximum of \$25. <u>Do not</u> exceed this amount. This ministry is not about providing a child with the most expensive gift possible, but rather providing a gesture of love on behalf of their incarcerated parent.

GIFT WRAPPING

Your gift must be wrapped with the provided message tag attached.

MESSAGE TAG

Attached to this document is a blank "special message" gift tag. We will send you an email providing a message from the incarcerated parent to their child. Once you receive that email, please hand write the message onto the gift tag and stick it to your wrapped gift.

DELIVERY DAY

Bring your gift to Renovation Church at **10:30 am on Saturday, December 14th.** We will gather together to pray for the Angel Tree families and go over a few delivery details, including tips for engaging and praying with families, as well as extending an invitation to come to church.

CARD FOR CAREGIVER

Each gift delivery will include a Christmas card (provided by Renovation Church) to give to the child's caregiver. The card will contain a \$5 Starbucks gift card and an invitation to a Renovation Church Christmas Service. We hope this gesture will bless the caregivers, and provide opportunity for further spiritual connection points.
